Testing Calendar Requirements

Prior to the first day of school, districts must post required testing calendar information on the district website and, if practicable, the school websites. Districts may choose how to format the information, and it should be easily accessible to students and families. This is especially important for test administration dates, which must include the specific day(s) when each grade will take each type of test at each school, **not** just the dates of the state-designated [2017–2018 Testing Calendar](#) (MDE website > Districts, Schools and Educators > Teaching and Learning > Statewide Testing > Minnesota Tests > 2017–2018 Testing Calendar).

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Reimbursement Request Deadline Approaching

Districts use the Graduation Requirements Records (GRR) system to request reimbursements for the cost of college entrance exams. The Reimbursement Reports, which are used to review and confirm the accuracy of a district's requests, are available in GRR for those who have already submitted reimbursement requests.

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WIDA Screener Update

There are three approved English Language Proficiency (ELP) screeners in Minnesota: the WIDA Screener, the Kindergarten W-APT, and the Kindergarten MODEL.

The WIDA Screener has an online version and a paper version. Districts are strongly encouraged to make the transition to the WIDA Screener no later than Aug. 31, 2017, which is when WIDA will no longer support W-APT in grades 1–12 and remove related resources from its website. While the online option for the WIDA Screener is free, some of the paper screener items are available from WIDA for a nominal fee. If you have any questions, please email mde.el@state.mn.us.

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Updating Contacts in MDE-ORG

With the start of the new school year, please ensure that the contact information is correct and up-to-date in the [MDE-ORG system](#) (MDE website > Data Center > Schools and Organizations (MDE-ORG)). This is especially important for DAC contacts, as there will be a series of new DAC trainings coming this fall.

All contact information in MDE-ORG is updated and maintained by the district's Site Verification Coordinator (SVC). You can look up the SVC for your district in MDE-ORG directly. If the SVC has any questions about the process, they can contact mde.school-verify@state.mn.us.

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Science Simulation Pilot

Pearson and MDE are looking for schools and districts to help pilot a series of science simulations that collect “activity stream” data from student actions.

- The study will be conducted throughout the 2017–2018 school year, and there should be a minimum of 50 students in grade 5 and/or 50 students in grade 8 participating from a district or school.
- The students will test five simulations that will each take 15 to 30 minutes, provide feedback on the simulations, and take a short traditional assessment for comparison.
- In conjunction with Pearson, teachers will schedule the simulations to fit in the curriculum, review the results for comparison to other assessments, and provide the end-of-year science scores.
- Schools will need to provide devices that have the latest technical requirements for using TestNav.

Note: The five simulations include forces in the solar system, engineering design principles, using satellite imagery, principles of force and motion, and food webs and biomes. Though the curriculum may not cover all five topics, your participation in them as enrichment activities is welcome.
