Local Assessment and Advisory Committee Applications

Statewide Testing is advised by a variety of groups and organizations, each serving a specific role. The combined efforts of these groups contribute significantly to the program. One of these groups, the Local Assessment and Advisory Committee (LAAC), is looking for additional committee members.

This committee advises MDE on assessment and technical issues. In the past year, the committee has advised MDE on issues ranging from assessment redesign to testing calendar approval. Three virtually held

meetings (October, April, and July) are currently planned. Members may include superintendents, charter school directors, principals, District Assessment Coordinator (DACs), and district program coordinators.

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Reading Alternate MCA Test Specifications

Following the 2020 revisions to the Minnesota K–12 Academic Standards in English Language Arts (ELA), the Reading Alternate MCA (formerly MTAS) will begin assessing these standards in the spring of 2026 for students with significant cognitive disabilities. In collaboration with a committee of Minnesota educators, MDE has drafted the Reading Alternate Minnesota Comprehensive Assessment Test Specifications to assist with the development of the new assessments. In addition to test specifications, the document includes extended benchmarks, which are based on the new Minnesota reading benchmarks but reduced in depth, breadth, and complexity.

Members of the public are encouraged to review the proposed test specifications and provide feedback through the Reading Alternate MCA Test Specifications Feedback Survey. The survey will be open until Friday, Sept. 3.

Feedback from multiple perspectives, including language arts and special education teachers, is important in creating the best assessment possible for Minnesota students with significant cognitive disabilities. Please share this information with applicable district staff.

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2023–24 State Testing Calendar

The draft 2023–24 State Testing Calendar is posted on the <u>Statewide Testing</u> page, under the Testing Calendar expandable header. Send any comments to <u>mde.testing@state.mn.us</u>.

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District Testing Calendar

Districts are required to post a comprehensive testing calendar on the district website before the first day of the school year; this information may also be posted on school-level websites if the district chooses. Districts may choose how to display the information (e.g., in a chart, a calendar format), but it should be presented in a way that is as easy to access as possible. Core requirements for the district testing calendar have not changed and are detailed in the <u>2020–21 Procedures Manual</u>, starting on page 121.

The posting of a district testing calendar is a requirement of both state legislation and ESSA, and is required to be posted for the 2021–22 school year. If a district has not yet established specific dates when students will be testing, MDE recommends using last year's planned dates as a starting place and then updating them as schedules are known or changed.

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Embargoed Test Results Summary

Embargoed 2020–21 district and state summary results will be available in Test Results Summary on Aug. 6 in Secure Reports. During the embargo, districts can use final assessment results, including the DSR/SSR files and reports created in Test Results Summary to prepare for questions from the media and local stakeholders. It is up to the district to determine whether or not to share embargoed results with students, families, and staff for instructional purposes. Embargoed results cannot, however, be discussed in public forums, reflected in public meeting minutes (e.g., school board meetings), or shared with the general public or media until the public release.

Information Available in Test Results Summary

Note the following about information available in Test Results Summary:

- No summary data or accountability was calculated for 2020 as there was very limited testing and very limited data due to COVID-19. Therefore, 2020 will not appear in the Year filter in Test Results Summary.
- There are also no accountability calculations for 2021. Therefore, under the Students Included filter in Test Results Summary, the "Students Included in Accountability" option will not produce any information. Use only the "All Tested" option to run reports.
