Assessment Results Remain Embargoed

As districts prepare for back-to-school events, it is important to remember that all assessment results are under embargo until Aug. 24.

During the embargo, districts can use the final assessment results to prepare for questions from the media and local stakeholders. They may share the results with district teachers and staff for planning or instructional purposes, and they may also share individual scores with students and families. However, they may not share any results in public settings. Refer to Chapter 11 of the <u>Procedures Manual</u>, which provides guidelines for using the assessment data and abiding by the embargo.

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North Star Secure Report and Academic Secure Roster Functionality

Due to current state race/ethnicity development on the North Star Secure Report and the Academic Secure Roster, we are aware of these not functioning properly. MDE will have this resolved on Aug. 7.

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Accountability Secure Release and Appeals

Secure rosters with academic achievement, academic progress, progress toward English language proficiency, and consistent attendance data will be available on **Monday**, **Aug. 7**, as will the interactive North Star secure report.

The window to appeal accountability data is Aug. 7–11. The acceptable grounds for appeal are (a) calculation error and (b) extenuating circumstances disrupting the usability of data. Appeals can be sent to mde.essa@state.mn.us.

Two webinars to review the accountability calculations and demonstrate the process of accessing the secure reports will be held that week. Additional webinar opportunities will be offered closer to the Aug. 24 public release date. The currently scheduled webinars are:

Privacy Technical Assistance Center Webinars on Student Privacy and Data Security (Repeat)

The full cycle of statewide assessments—from preparation to administration, then post-test data analysis—depends upon effective student privacy and data security policies at the state and district level. For those who are interested in learning more on these topics or reinforcing current knowledge, the Privacy Technical Assistance Center (PTAC) within the U.S. Department of Education is providing a three-day webinar in August. These trainings are relevant to many roles and staff who are not involved in statewide assessments as well. - Day 1: Register for FERPA 101 and FERPA 201, Wednesday, Aug. 16, 1–3 p.m. These sessions will cover the basics of FERPA, including scenarios faced by schools and districts.
- Day 2: Register for Data Security and Data Breach Incident Response, Wednesday, Aug. 23, 1–3 p.m.
 These sessions provide training on current data security best practices for education data systems and leads participants through a simulated data breach.
- Day 3: <u>Register for Vetting Educational Technology and Transparency</u>, Wednesday, Aug. 30, 1–3 p.m.
 These sessions will explore the importance of and the means by which online educational technology
 can be assessed for privacy protections and general FERPA compliance, followed by highlights from
 PTAC's research study on transparency.
