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Procedures Manual for 2022–23

The 2022–23 Procedures Manual for Minnesota Statewide Assessments will be posted on the Policies and Procedures page of PearsonAccess Next on Sept. 30 The Procedures Manual has been prepared for DACs, administrators, and others with a role in administering statewide assessments. It provides the MDE's policies and procedures for implementing statewide assessments and using the results in your district or charter school.

There are a variety of ways to use the manual:

- Keep an electronic copy on your computer and make frequent use of the Find function (Ctrl + F, Command + F).
- Review the "What's New" list in Chapter 1 and use the "New!" and "Info!" symbols to search for information that is new or clarified for this year.
- Print some of the lists to use as checklists.
- Refer to the *Important Dates* in the front of the manual to schedule testing in your district and make sure you do not miss an important task.
- Provide specific chapters to district and school staff (for example, special education staff or English learner staff), as needed.

Note: For new DACs, MDE will discuss how to use the *Procedures Manual* as a reference and suggest ways to break up the content throughout the school year during New DAC Orientation.

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Benchmark Achievement Level Descriptors on Testing 1, 2, 3

The <u>Benchmark Achievement Level Descriptor (Benchmark ALD</u>) documents posted on the Success Criteria page of the Testing 1, 2, 3 website have been updated so that links to released MCA items in the documents are directed to the new Minnesota Questions Tool (MQT). As part of this update, additional items in Mathematics and Reading MCA were released in MQT and linked into the Benchmark ALD documents.

A training module is available on the same webpage to learn how to use the Benchmark ALDs to evaluate the rigor of classroom assessments and instructional materials.

If you have used these documents in the past, the new document may not be loading properly when you click on the link for grade 3 math and reading. If you are experiencing this error, you need to either clear the history from your browser or clear the cache in your browser when you visit the page.

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2022-23 College Entrance Exam Requirement

As in past years, districts are required to offer a nationally recognized college entrance exam (ACT or SAT) to grades 11 and 12 students during a 2022–23 school day. Districts must enter into a contract directly with the test vendor. As of the 2021–22 school year, College Board no longer offers the SAT with Essay. While a district may offer other assessment options to students at their discretion (for example, ASVAB or ACCUPLACER), a college entrance exam must still be offered. The requirements for offering a college entrance exam have not changed and are detailed in the <u>Procedures Manual</u>. More information about ACT and College Board is included below.

ACT

- Districts will need to provide ACT the percentage of students who are eligible for free or reduced-priced meals to determine if the district will get a reduced price from ACT.

New DAC Orientation: Registration

Apply to be a MTAS Field Auditor

Each year, MDE employs Field Auditors to observe MTAS administrations in selected schools around the state and to gather evidence to evaluate the validity and reliability of the assessment. MTAS Field Auditors serve as evidence-gatherers; their job is to obtain evidence that will determine 1) the extent to which the training of the administration was properly implemented and 2) the consistency of the administration for students across the state. For 2022–23, MDE is looking for auditors to do between 8–10 days of work from February–May.

MTAS Field Auditors must be able to travel within an approximate 100-mile radius of their home area. This year, MDE is especially seeking auditors who can serve the regions of Sartell, Rochester, and the Twin Cities Metro.

Field auditors must have these minimum qualifications:

- Current or retired educator or administrator, with licensure in Minnesota
- Experience working with students with disabilities in an educational setting
- Three years of classroom experience

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Tech Update

Central Office Services Service Device (COS-SD) Update

In preparation for ACCESS online testing this year, there will be an update to the COS Service Device (COS-SD) tomorrow evening, Sept. 29.

- Devices connected to the Internet and left on overnight will automatically receive this update to version 6.2.
- Devices that are not left on overnight, or do not automatically update, can continue to be used to support student testing. These devices can be manually updated using the WIDA AMS Central Office Services application.

This update is designed to enhance the logging capabilities of the COS-SD. This will allow DRC to better investigate issues and will remove the need for site intervention to get access to the logs.
