New for 2022–23: Video ISRs

Personalized video ISRs for students with MCA and MTAS scores will be available on Aug. 24. These videos include an overview of the assessment and the student’s performance in each subject taken, as well as their performance related to the school, district, and state averages. In addition to English, video ISRs may be available in a home language based on student enrollment data, if specified (Amharic, Arabic, Chinese, Hmong, Karen, Oromo, Russian, Somali, Spanish, and Vietnamese).

Parents/guardians can access video ISRs by scanning a QR code on the ISR with a smart device or by contacting their student’s school for a link to access the video report. On Aug. 24, video list files (csv) with links for video ISRs for students with scores will be available at the school or district level under Published Reports in PearsonAccess Next.

Students without a score in at least one subject have no QR code on their ISR and no video report available.

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District Testing Calendar

Districts are required to post a comprehensive testing calendar on the district website; this information may also be posted on school-level websites if the district chooses. The calendar must be published at least one week

prior to any eligible assessments being administered, but **no later than October 1**, which is a change due to state legislation passed this year. Districts may choose how to display the information (for example, in a chart or a calendar format), but it should be presented in a way that is as easy to access as possible. Core requirements for the information that must be included on the district testing calendar have not changed and are detailed in Chapter 6 of the [Procedures Manual](#).

If a district has not yet established specific dates when students will be testing, MDE recommends using previous years' timeframes as a starting place and then updating them as schedules are known or changed.

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Volunteer Opportunity: Help Improve the WIDA ACCESS Speaking Test

In response to feedback from teachers, WIDA is trying out new features for the ACCESS Speaking Test, including a feature that would allow students to add to their responses. In order to make research-based improvements to the test design, WIDA is seeking schools to volunteer for Cognitive Labs, or research sessions. Schools or districts with English Learners in grades 2–3 and/or 9–12 can participate. Programs will be asked to recruit 6–16 students to participate in a 30–40 minute session with WIDA researchers to take part of the ACCESS Speaking Test on a laptop and then share their opinions. 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Privacy Technical Assistance Center (PTAC) Webinars on Student Privacy and Data Security

The full cycle of statewide assessments, from preparation, to administration, and data analysis, depends upon effective student privacy and data security policies at the state and district level. For those who are interested in learning more on these topics or reinforcing current knowledge, the Privacy Technical Assistance Center (PTAC) within the U.S. Department of Education is providing a three-day webinar in August. These trainings are relevant to many roles and staff who are not involved in statewide assessments as well. - Day 2: [Register for Data Security and Data Breach Incident Response](#), Wednesday, Aug. 23, 2023, 1–3 p.m. These sessions provide training on current data security best practices for education data systems and leads participants through a simulated data breach.
- Day 3: [Register for Vetting Educational Technology and Transparency](#), Wednesday, Aug. 30, 2023, 1–3 p.m. These sessions will explore the importance of and the means by which online educational

technology can be assessed for privacy protections and general FERPA compliance, followed by highlights from PTAC's research study on transparency.
