Final Assessment Results Release

Assessment and accountability results will be released to the public on Thursday, Aug. 25. To accommodate the release of the 2022 results, the Minnesota Report Card will be unavailable on Wednesday, Aug. 24, with the new results available the following day. If users try to access the Minnesota Report Card on Aug. 24, a message will appear regarding the temporary site closure.

After the results are released publicly, assessment results information will be available in two places on the MDE website for families, educators, and community members to access:

- The [Minnesota Report Card](#) allows users to create graphs and tables to view results for various groups of students across the state and within districts and schools. A [Minnesota Report Card User Guide](#) (select Using the Report Card menu choice) provides information on interpreting and using the data on the Report Card.
- Downloadable data files are under [Assessment Files](#) (MDE website > Data Center > Data Reports and Analytics), which provide summary assessment data for the state, county, districts, and schools that can be used to perform analyses. The [Assessment Files User Guide](#) (linked in the overview paragraph located at the top of the Assessment Files page) provides information about the content of the files; information is also available on the first tab of the files.

Embargo Reminder

During the embargo, districts may share the results with district teachers and staff for planning or instructional purposes, but may not share the summary results in public settings. Districts can also use the final embargoed results to prepare for questions from the media and local stakeholders, but if a media outlet contacts a district before the public release of results, the district should redirect them to the MDE Communications division. To review the report, select Posttest Discrepancies under File Transfer on the Test WES Dashboard. The discrepancies on the report cannot be resolved.

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Final Individual Student Reports Delivery

Final Individual Student Reports (ISRs) for both MCA/MTAS and ACCESS/Alternate ACCESS are scheduled to arrive in districts on Thursday, Aug. 25.

- ISRs for ACCESS/Alternate ACCESS will be provided for all students who participated. For students who had a test code indicated for one or more domains, N/A will be reported on the ISR for the domain(s) and all associated composite scores.
- ISRs for MCA/MTAS will be provided for all students who participated. For students who did not participate, the ISR will show why results are not included (for example, parent or student refusal test code indicated or not complete).

Since ISRs contain private student data, **it is important for districts to ensure someone is available to receive the reports and secure them until distribution.** The final reports shipment will be sent to districts, and each school will have its own box labeled with the school name. For nonpublic schools, final reports will be packaged and shipped directly to each school.

ACCESS and Alternate ACCESS Reports Shipment

The boxes will include the following reports for ACCESS and Alternate ACCESS:

- Individual Student Reports (ISRs)
- Student Roster Reports
- District and School Frequency Reports

They provide general information about the ACCESS and are available in Word format so that they can be customized at the district as desired with local test administration information and state or district policies. The boxes will include the following:

- Packing list of contents and cover memo (in box 1 for each school)
- ISRs for MCA and MTAS
 - Reports will be sorted by grade and test administration (MCA or MTAS).
 - To assist with the sorting, each ISR is marked with a color tab according to grade, subject, and assessment. The packing list indicates the sort order and corresponding color tabs.
- Student results labels (if requested in Test WES)
