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## ***Procedures Manual for 2021–22***

The *2021–22 Procedures Manual for Minnesota Statewide Assessments* will be posted on the [Policies and Procedures](#) page of PearsonAccess Next on Friday, Oct. 1. The *Procedures Manual* has been prepared for DACs, administrators, and others with a role in administering statewide assessments. It provides the Minnesota policies and procedures for implementing statewide assessments and using the results in your district or charter school.

This version of the *Procedures Manual* provides policy and procedure information for a typical school year and test administration. As needed, updated information will be communicated through the *Assessment Update*.

Note: Like last year, all statewide assessments will be administered in person and at school this year; there will be no remote administration options available for any assessments.

There are a variety of ways to use the manual:

- Keep an electronic copy on your computer and make frequent use of the Find function (Ctrl + F, Command + F).
- Review the “What’s New” list in Chapter 1 and use the “New!” and “Info!” symbols to search for information that is new or clarified for this year.
- Print some of the lists to use as checklists.

- Refer to the *Important Dates* in the front of the manual to schedule testing in your district and make sure you do not miss an important task.
- Provide specific chapters to district and school staff (e.g., special education staff or English learner staff), as needed.

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## ***Virtual New DAC Orientation: Registration***

In October, MDE and Pearson will provide a Virtual New DAC Orientation. This virtual event will be spread across three days for a few hours each day, and each session will cover different topics. MDE recommends that DACs attend the live sessions, if possible, as they will include interactive information sharing as well as time to discuss topics with colleagues. However, the presentation will be recorded for each day's sessions if participants are unable to attend all three sessions live. DACs should sign up for all three sessions, as each session will provide different information.

MDE will provide an overview of the various roles and responsibilities of a DAC, the statewide assessments administered in Minnesota, relevant MDE and WIDA systems, available resources, and training opportunities. Pearson will provide information on Pearson systems and available resources. Though designed as an introduction for new DACs in their first or second year, other relatively new DACs are also welcome to attend.

### **Prerequisites**

To prepare for the orientation, new DACs are encouraged to review the following New DAC trainings: *Understanding Training Requirements*, *Scheduling Testing*, and *Testing Policies and Procedures*. These trainings will be available in the [Training Management System \(TMS\)](#) on Oct. 1, under the District Assessment Coordinator tab, New DAC Trainings category. The *Minnesota Assessments Overview* training in this category is optional as the orientation will address much of the content in this training. Note: If you are a brand new DAC, you will use your district email to access TMS and select your district to create your account.

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## ***Benchmark Achievement Level Descriptors (ALDs)***

The [Benchmark Achievement Level Descriptors \(ALDs\)](#) are a resource for educators that describe in more detail some of the knowledge, skills, and abilities students typically demonstrate across the four achievement levels on the Reading and Mathematics MCAs. Descriptions are outlined for each benchmark from the standards at each achievement level. If staff are choosing to use this year’s benchmark reports to discuss curriculum and instruction in the context of last school year, these resources can be used alongside the reports to guide discussions about reading and mathematics instruction. The purpose of the Benchmark ALDs is to:

- Promote equity for all students across the state by clarifying the expected learning outcomes for instruction and classroom assessment, which are aligned to the Minnesota Academic Standards in reading and mathematics.
- Support teacher analysis of the depth of their curriculum, instruction, and classroom assessments.

The Benchmark ALDs are available in two formats and are available for reading and mathematics only. The table format is organized by benchmarks within a grade level, while the vertical articulation version is organized by a list of each benchmark’s descriptors across grade levels. The specific descriptions of the knowledge, skills, and abilities are the same in both. A training module is also available on the same page of the [Testing 1, 2, 3](#) website. 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## ***2021–22 College Entrance Exam Requirement***

As in past years, districts are required to offer a nationally recognized college entrance exam (ACT or SAT) to grades 11 and 12 students during a 2021–2022 school day. Districts must enter into a contract directly with the

test vendor. The requirements for offering a college entrance exam have not changed and are detailed in the [Procedures Manual](#). More information about ACT and College Board is included below.

## ACT

- Districts will need to provide ACT the percentage of students that are eligible for free or reduced-priced meals to determine if the district will get a reduced price from ACT.

Please encourage teaching staff to participate. While it requires seven days out of the classroom, it is a fantastic professional development opportunity for teachers.

### **Planned DRC Outages**

During the 2021-22 academic year, DRC will periodically conduct system maintenance that may result in downtime for WIDA AMS and/or the DRC INSIGHT Secure Applications.

- WIDA AMS Updates take place every four weeks on Thursdays, starting at 8 p.m. from November through May: Nov. 18, Dec. 16, Jan. 13, Feb. 10, March 10, April 7, and May 5. Services may be unavailable for approximately 60-90 minutes during each update.
- Security Patching of Servers, Databases, and Network will take place on Nov. 6–7, Dec. 4–5, Jan. 1–2, Feb. 5–6, March 5–6, April 2–3, April 30–May 1, June 4–5, July 2–3, and Aug. 6–7. These security patches will impact WIDA AMS, including Screener Scoring. Services will be unavailable from Saturday 11 p.m. to Sunday 11 a.m.
