

## AN UPDATE FROM STATEWIDE TESTING – AUGUST 8, 2018

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## District Testing Calendar

As in the past, districts must post their testing calendar on the district website; this information may also be posted on the school-level website(s), if the district chooses. Districts may choose how to display the information (e.g., in a chart, in calendar format). While links to the information may be provided rather than including all the information in one place, districts should present the information so it is accessible as possible. This is especially important for test administration dates. For example, the test administration dates for each school can be directly posted on the district’s website with the other testing calendar information, or links to each school’s website could be provided.

### Requirements

Districts are required to have their testing calendars posted by the first day of the school year; the following requirements have not changed from last year. For more information, refer to the list on page 129 of the [2017–18 Procedures Manual](#) (PearsonAccess Next > Resources & Training > Policies and Procedures).

- Include information about all tests administered, not just statewide testing.
- Post the specific dates when the majority of students will be testing for each grade and subject at each school within the district. The actual test administration dates must be posted, not just the dates of the state-designated testing window. However, at the beginning of the school year, the best estimates for

the dates should be included. Specific dates should be updated as changes are identified, preferably no later than two months before the applicable testing window.

- Provide the subject matter for each assessment.
- Provide the purpose and rationale for each assessment, including the source of the requirement.
- Include the amount of time students will spend taking the assessment.
- Include the timeline and format for disseminating assessment results.

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## ***Reimbursement Reports in GRR***

After districts request reimbursement in the Graduation Requirements Records (GRR) for 2017–18, districts should confirm expected reimbursements using the reimbursement reports, which are refreshed early each morning to reflect the current state of entries in GRR:

- The *Claimed Student Detail Report* details what records will be reimbursed (or the reason records will not be reimbursed).
- The *Estimated Student Amount Report* gives an estimate of the amount that will be received.

Note: For unable to pay, reimbursement may be on a pro-rated basis depending on number of requests. The *Estimated Student Amount Report* will estimate pro-rated amounts, when applicable, and will remain an estimate until requests are finalized.

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## ***New WIDA Website***

Starting on Aug. 15, WIDA will have a new website and a new URL ([wida.wisc.edu](http://wida.wisc.edu)). This new site will contain general information about the WIDA suite of assessments, the WIDA Standards, and professional learning. As with the current website, there will be a login to access the WIDA Secure Portal, which will remain largely the same. 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## ***Accountability: Secure Release and Appeals Window***

As of 3 p.m. this afternoon, district and school staff with [Secure Reports](#) (MDE website > Data Center > Secure Reports) access can view data for the [North Star accountability system](#) (MDE website > Districts, Schools and Educators > School Achievement > School and District Accountability). In the Accountability Secure Reports

section of Secure Reports, access the *North Star Secure Report* for information about school and district identification for support as well as performance on each indicator in the North Star system. If a school in your district has been identified because a student group is performing similarly to the bottom 5% of Title I schools in stages 1–3, you will have information regarding this identification in a document sent via the File Exchange (under File Transfer) on [Test WES](#) (MDE website > Districts, Schools and Educators > Business and Finance > Data Submissions > Test WES).

Users can download secure rosters for *Academic Achievement and Progress* and for *Progress Toward English Language Proficiency*. Note: Secure rosters for *Graduation* and *Consistent Attendance* have been available since the spring.

Also as of this afternoon, the accountability appeals window is now open. Requests for an appeal can be made through this [online survey tool for accountability appeals](#). The two grounds for appeal are:

- An error has been found in the accountability calculations.
- Unusual circumstances (e.g., a natural disaster) impacted the data for a school or district such that the data are unreliable.

- **Precode Student Eligibility Year-End Transition:** Precode Student Eligibility in Test WES will close for 2017–18 on Aug. 10; it will reopen on Oct. 15 for 2018–19. Precode Student Eligibility will not be available between Aug. 10 and Oct. 15.
- **Longitudinal Reports and Historical Student Data in PearsonAccess Next Unavailable:** In preparation for loading the MCA and MTAS 2018 data in PearsonAccess Next, Longitudinal Reports and Historical Student Data will be unavailable from Aug. 13–29. TestNav apps are now available for the 2018–19 school year. Version 1.7.3 of the TestNav apps can be downloaded from the [TestNav 8 Online Support Page](#) (PearsonAccess Next > TestNav 8 Online Support (under Quick Links)) or from the following locations. Prior to testing, ensure that all devices being used for spring 2019 MCA testing have been updated to the latest version.
