Assessment Results Remain Embargoed

All assessment results are under embargo until Aug. 30, which is later than past years due to MDE releasing the assessment and accountability results together. During the embargo, districts can use the final assessment results to prepare for questions from the media and local stakeholders. They may share the results with district teachers and staff for planning or instructional purposes, but they may not share the results in public settings. MDE will use the North Star accountability system to publicly release results. 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Student Assessment History Report Rollover

The [Student Assessment History Report](#) allows districts to look up the testing history for individuals who are enrolled in the district as verified by MARSS (MDE website > Data Center > Secure Reports). The Student Assessment History Report will rollover to the new school year on Aug. 14 (at 4 p.m.), and districts will only have access for students who are included in MARSS enrollment for the 2018–19 school year. Until districts submit MARSS enrollment data for the new school year after MARSS submissions open on Aug. 15, they will not have any data in the Student Assessment History Report.

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New WIDA Website

Starting on Aug. 15, WIDA will have a new website and a new URL (wida.wisc.edu). This new site will contain general information about the WIDA suite of assessments, the WIDA Standards, and professional learning. As with the current website, there will be a login to access the WIDA Secure Portal. The Secure Portal will remain largely the same. 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Reporting Training from Pearson

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2018–19 College Entrance Exam Update

As in past years, districts are required to offer a nationally recognized college entrance exam (ACT or SAT) to grade 11 and 12 students during a 2018–19 school day. Districts must enter into a contract directly with the test vendor; refer to the information below including the ACT updates for 2018–19.

ACT

- **New for 2018–19:**
 - Districts will need to provide ACT the percent of students eligible for free or reduced priced meals to determine if the district will get a reduced price from ACT. Districts are to get the information from the [Minnesota Report Card](#) (MDE website > Data Center > Minnesota Report

Card). Under Enrollment, select Demographics and then 2018 Enrollment by Special Populations to find the percentage for Free/Reduced Priced Lunch.

- Beginning this year, the fees owed will be based on the total number of students included in the district's file(s) in the ACT Online Platform as of the first day of the Makeup Testing Window.
