

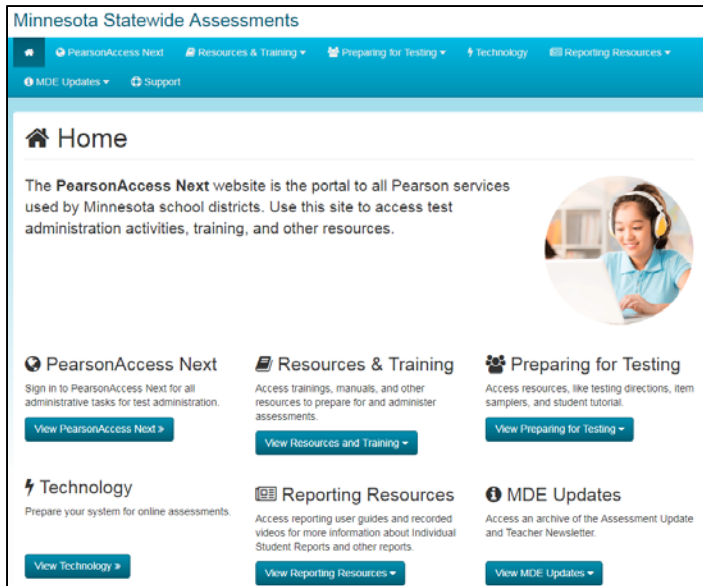

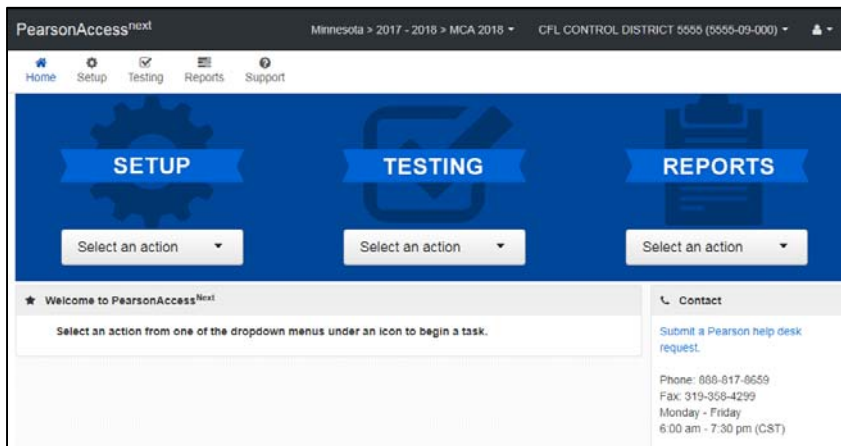

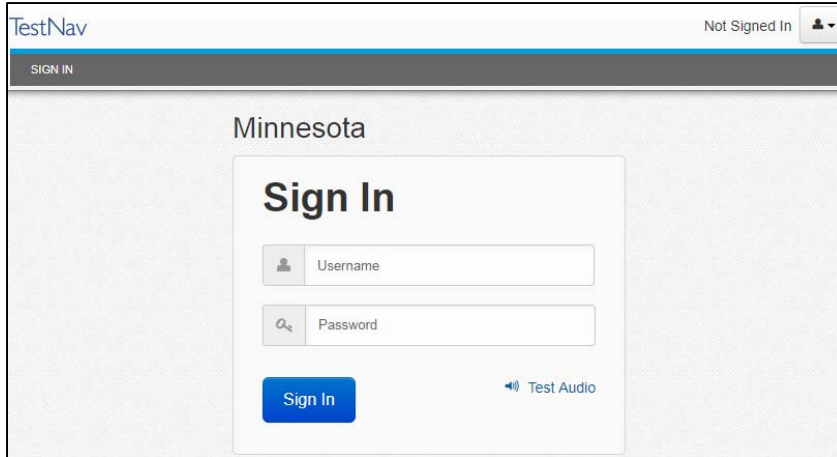

It is downloaded and installed by technology staff. Getting Started

1. Review [TestNav System Requirements](#) and firewall/port settings for testing devices. You can use installable TestNav apps or Firefox Extended Support Release (ESR) for tests that require kiosk mode.
2. If using ProctorCache, review [ProctorCache System Requirements](#), and then install ProctorCache on designated proctor caching computers.
 - a. Pre-cache test content through your assessment management system. Your program should provide instructions for pre-caching test content.
3. Complete infrastructure trial in each testing lab using a practice test. Your program should provide instructions for setting up a practice test through your assessment management system.

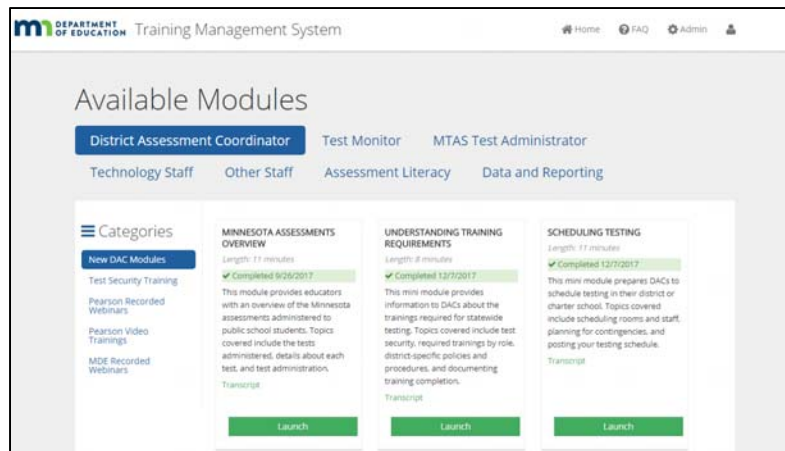

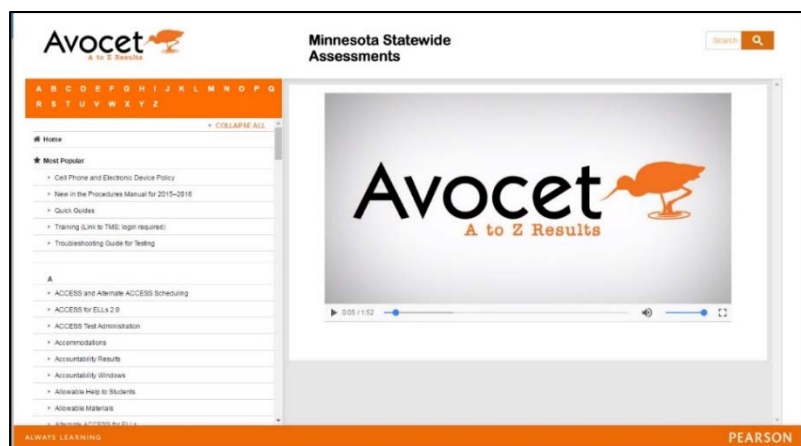
Training Management System home page

Avocet home page



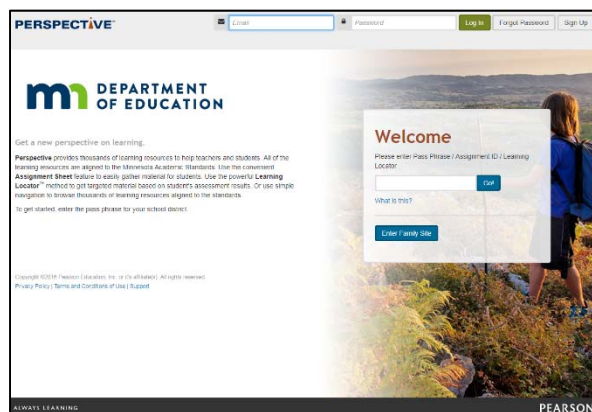
Perspective

Perspective provides thousands of learning resources for teachers and students. All of the resources are aligned to the Minnesota Academic Standards.

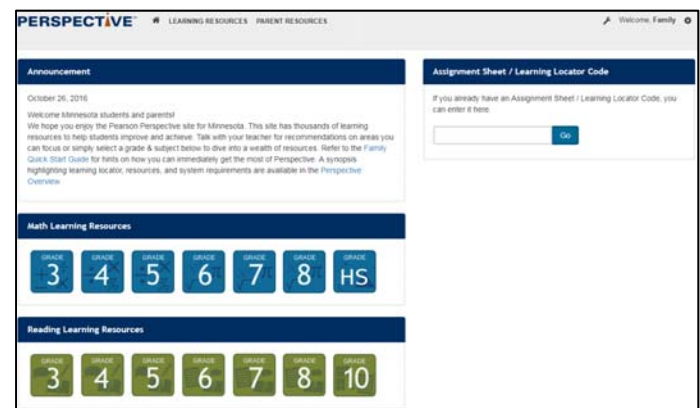
There are two areas of the Perspective website that can be accessed from the Perspective log in page: [Perspective for Educators](#) (PearsonAccess Next > Perspective for Educators (under Quick Links)) and [Perspective for Families](#) (PearsonAccess Next > Perspective for Families (under Quick Links)).

- For Perspective for Educators, resources are available to browse without an account but creating an account is required in order to create assignments and use the Test Builder feature to assign quizzes and tests to students. To access Perspective for Educators without an account, enter the “mn_edu” pass phrase on the log in page.
- For Perspective for Families, resources are available without an account.

Learning Locator codes are provided on On-Demand Reports in PearsonAccess Next and on Individual Student Reports (ISRs) that are provided to families. These codes can be entered into Perspective to access resources aligned to MCA achievement levels.

- Teachers can use each student’s Learning Locator code in Perspective for Educators to create specific assignments as needed. Teachers can also access the Learning Locator Codes for Educators, which provides look-up tables for mathematics, reading, and science by grade and achievement level, rather than using only individual student codes.
- Students and families can directly access the resources by entering the Learning Locator code into Perspective for Families.
