#### **Assessment Results Remain Embargoed**

As districts prepare for back-to-school events, it is important to remember that all assessment results are under embargo until Aug. 29.

During the embargo, districts can use the final assessment results to prepare for questions from the media and local stakeholders. They may share the results with district teachers and staff for planning or instructional purposes, and they may also share individual scores with students and families. However, they may not share any results in public settings. Refer to Chapter 11 of the <u>Procedures Manual</u>, which provides guidelines for using the assessment data and abiding by the embargo.

### **Accountability Secure Release and Appeals**

Secure rosters with academic achievement, academic progress, progress toward English language proficiency, and consistent attendance data will be available on **Monday**, **Aug. 5**, as will the interactive North Star secure report.

The window to appeal accountability data is Aug. 5–9. The acceptable grounds for appeal are calculation error and extenuating circumstances disrupting the usability of data. Appeals can be sent to <a href="mailto:mde.essa@state.mn.us">mde.essa@state.mn.us</a>.

## WIDA Alternate ACCESS Exit Eligibility Notifications

Due to additional steps required for a new assessment, reporting for the WIDA Alternate ACCESS is delayed until this fall. In order to support reclassification and exit decisions, MDE has used a linking method and the definition of proficiency developed for the prior Alternate ACCESS to determine whether individual student scale scores on the WIDA Alternate ACCESS make a student eligible for exit. Districts with students who participated in the WIDA Alternate ACCESS can now find a file containing each student's eligibility for exit posted in MDE's <u>Test WES</u> system via File Exchange (located in the left menu under File Transfer). All DACs have access to Test WES to download and save this file for the district's records.

DACs are requested to share WIDA Alternate ACCESS exit eligibility notifications with the appropriate EL staff. The exit eligibility files only indicate whether a student is eligible for exit: the files do not contain scales scores or proficiency levels for your students. That data will be available to districts when the DSR/SSR (District and School

Student Results) is released for WIDA Alternate ACCESS in late September. Guidance on identification, entrance, and exit for English Learners who participate in the WIDA Alternate ACCESS can be found on the <u>English Learner Education</u> page of the MDE website.

Note: Final WIDA Alternate ACCESS results will be reported using Alternate Proficiency Level Descriptors (Alternate PLDs). These new scores will range from proficiency level 1 to 5 and will be distinct from other ACCESS assessments, including the prior version of the Alternate ACCESS. As a result, a student's eligibility to exit using 2024 WIDA Alternate ACCESS scores can only be determined using the WIDA Alternate ACCESS exit eligibility notifications provided in Test WES. MDE will begin a process to review the definition of proficiency and exit criteria for the updated WIDA Alternate ACCESS in the 2024–25 school year.
