Deadline This Friday for ACCESS Requests

The deadline to request a scoring appeal, transcription request, or test booklet search for spring 2024 ACCESS is this **Friday, Sept. 13**. Due to delayed reporting for the WIDA Alternate ACCESS, the deadline to request a scoring appeal, transcription request, or test booklet search for spring 2024 WIDA Alternate ACCESS is Tuesday, Oct. 29.

- Scoring appeals may be requested for either the Writing (paper or online) or Speaking (online only)
 domains of the grades 1–12 ACCESS when there is a concern that a student's test may have been scored
 incorrectly. DACs must email mde.testing@state.mn.us with the student's MARSS/SSID number and the
 rationale for the score appeal.
- Transcription requests may be submitted if there is concern that a student or Test Administrator did not
 use a Number 2 pencil or did not fill in the bubble or answer area to completion for paper test materials.
- Test booklet searches may be requested when student's score was not included results and it is suspected that a completed test booklet 1) had a district/school label but no student information bubbled, 2) bubbled student information but no district/school label, or 3) a Do Not Score Label applied.

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Testing Calendar Updates

District Testing Calendar Reminder

Districts are required to post a comprehensive testing calendar on the district website; this information may also be posted on school-level websites if the district chooses. The calendar must be published at least one week prior to any eligible assessments being administered, but no later than Oct. 1. Districts may choose how to display the information (for example, in a chart or a calendar format), but it should be presented in a way that is as easy to access as possible. Core requirements for the information that must be included on the district testing calendar have not changed and are detailed in Chapter 6 of the *Procedures Manual*.

If a district has not yet established specific dates when students will be testing, MDE recommends using previous years' timeframes as a starting place and then updating them as testing schedules are known or changed. Districts should keep their testing calendar up to date throughout the school year.

State Testing Calendars

The draft 2026–27 Testing Calendar is posted on the <u>Statewide Testing</u> page, under the Testing Calendar expandable header. Send any comments to <u>mde.testing@state.mn.us</u>. Draft testing calendars are posted for one year before they are finalized. The 2024–25 Testing Calendar and 2025–26 Testing Calendar are also available.

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District Assessment Coordinator Trainings and Q&A Sessions (2024–25)

The District Assessment Coordinator Trainings and Q&A Sessions has been updated and is in the process of being posted on the District Resources page of the MDE website (under the District Assessment Coordinator Resources expandable heading). This document provides dates and times for MDE trainings and Q&A sessions for DACs for planning purposes. Note: The download link is currently being updated and is expected to be available by the end of the week.

For the 2024–25 year, MDE will be offering a combination of in-person and virtual training sessions, with some trainings only offered virtually. All DACs, new and experienced, are invited and welcome to attend all events; however, some of the events are designed specifically to support new DACs in their role. Detailed information, links to prerequisites, and registration information will be provided prior to the event in the weekly *Assessment*

Update. In addition, information about WIDA/Data Recognition Corporation (DRC) and Pearson trainings will be provided in the *Assessment Update*.

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2024–25 ACCESS Manuals and Redesigned Training Courses Available Now

The ACCESS Test Administrator Manual, District and School Test Coordinator Manual, and Test Administrator Essentials have been updated for the 2024–25 testing year and are available in the WIDA Secure Portal (login required) under Resources.

- New Test Administrators and new District and School Assessment Coordinators should read through the sections of the manual relevant to their role in testing.
- Experienced Test Administrators and District and School Assessment Coordinators should read the updates in the "New for the 2024–25 School Year" section, and review other sections as needed.
- All WIDA Alternate ACCESS test administrators should read part 2, section 7 of the *Test Administrator Manual* in its entirety to become familiar with the updated operational assessment.

WIDA's updated ACCESS training courses are also available now, including the Online ACCESS for ELLs: Administration, Paper ACCESS for ELLs: Administration, and Alternate ACCESS: Administration and Scoring. These training courses can be found on the WIDA Secure Portal under Assessment Training. 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Opportunity for District SIS and Data Warehouse Vendors

For the spring 2025 test administrations, Student Information System (SIS) and data warehouse vendors will have the opportunity to receive regularly scheduled extracts of preliminary on-demand data for the Reading and Mathematics MCA and Reading and Mathematics MTAS during the testing window and/or final data extracts for all subjects of MCA and MTAS/Alt MCA and ACCESS/WIDA Alternate ACCESS following the release of the DSR/SSR files. These extracts allow vendors to load the data directly into their system for access by schools and districts. To participate in this service, districts and charters must enter into a data sharing agreement with their associated vendor and MDE. Vendors will be given the option of receiving preliminary data, final data, or both on behalf of their member districts. Vendors need to commit **no later than Friday, Oct. 18.**

The SIS and data warehouse vendors must configure their system to receive the preliminary data in the file layout provided by Pearson. A file layout for the final results will also be provided to participating vendors by MDE.
